Questions to be addressed onsite:

Session 1: HHD and Strategies to Empower Clinicians, Patients, and Caregivers

- What are the lessons learned that could be extended to Pacific Asia?
- What specific patient or cultural considerations (such as fear of cannulation) must be taken into account when promoting HHD? (including solo and home-assisted HD)
- What are the minimum standards for safety and approval for HHD?
- Are there emergency protocols?
- What is the extent and nature of HHD training/education that is required for patients and clinicians? (e.g., online curricula and toolkits)
 - Training for patients and caregivers
 - Training for clinicians
- How do we measure patient satisfaction (e.g., PROMs, PREMs)?
- How can caregiver burden and burnout be mitigated (e.g., respite care, financial compensation)?

Session 2: HHD and Strategies to Invoke Change with Dialysis Providers, Health Administrators, Payers, and Policymakers

- How do we assess the desire, feasibility and readiness of each region for HHD?
- What global examples can guide financially sustainable HHD programs?
 - Should in-center HD and HHD be funded differently?
- What payer metrics (e.g., QoL, patient satisfaction, hospitalizations, infections, other health outcomes, etc.) must be satisfied in order to demonstrate HHD as a viable treatment option?
- What are the benchmark metrics or key performance indicators for measuring the success of a HHD program?
 - How should we evaluate impact? Hospital burden? Short-term versus long-term costs?
 - How should one adapt telehealth to countries and what are the barriers?
- What are some incentives used to align all of the stakeholders?
- What would a global roadmap to successful HHD implementation include and who might develop it?
